## First Grade News...

We have just finished Unit 4 in LEAD21, where we focused on our Earth. We enjoyed learning about natural resources, including how we use them and how we should conserve them. During this unit, we were able to learn about comprehension skills, such as visualizing, drawing conclusions, and making connections. We were also excited to learn about different types of words, such as antonyms, synonyms, and homonyms.

We have been busy in math learning about subtraction and place value. We created and solved many story problems that require us to take-away. We have also counted large numbers of items, such as beans and cubes, so that we could understand the effectiveness of grouping and counting by 10s and 1s (leftovers).

We are currently learning about plants and animals in science. We planted rye grass and alfalfa seeds in our "lawns". We even planted wheat in a straw! We have focused on learning what plants need to survive; we have also identified plants parts and what their jobs are. It was very interesting to learn how seeds can travel! In the next few weeks, we will plant bulbs and learn about different animals in different habitats. We will also set up our plant/animal terrariums. The students are looking forward to the arrival of our bugs!

First Grade celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school TODAY! We were able to participate in many fun activities and workstations that all focused on the number 100. We were most excited that we are now 100 days smarter! We look forward to celebrating "Friendship Day" next Fri., Feb. 12.

# Winter Weather Guidelines...

\* Students will be outside in the morning for line-up and for recess if the wind chill is <u>zero degrees</u> or above, so make sure they always wear the proper clothing for the weather.

\* All students are required to bring boots to school every day beginning with the first snowfall. Additionally, students should have winter coats, hats and mittens / gloves at school each day.

\* Students should have an extra pair of shoes at school (in addition to their boots), so they have something dry to wear on their feet during the school day.

\* If students do not have boots they will be expected to remain on the blacktop at recess time, in order to keep their shoes and feet dry.

\* All students who play in the snow or on the field are required to wear snow pants, hat, gloves and boots.

\* <u>Note</u>: Families who need hats or gloves/mittens for their child should contact the school office as we have received donations from community groups for these items. Families are strongly encouraged to label your child's clothing with their first and last name. This will assist students to locate any lost or misplaced items.
