LEAD 21 – New People, New Places is the title of the unit that 5th grade started at the beginning of February. The guiding question is, "What events have shaped America?" This is a unit that not only teaches the history of our country but also looks to the future and how people shape a nation.

Science – 5th grade is currently learning about Living Systems.
