Improving Learning for All Students

Attendance matters! Thank you, parents and guardians, for making it a priority to have your children in school, on time, every day. Students with strong attendance, missing less than 10 days per year, are less likely to struggle with reading and more likely to graduate from high school.

Iowa Tests of Progress (ITP)

Students in grades 3-5 are taking ITP during the month of November. This measure gives us important information about your child and our instruction. We will analyze the results to inform our teaching, and you and your student will receive an individualized report. Typically, students complete the tests in six different sessions that are less than one hour each. How can you help your child be prepared? By doing the same things you do to help your child be ready to learn every day; provide plenty of sleep, a balance of work and play, and good nutrition! Across the state of lowa, a test called Smarter Balanced is slated to be the new accountability measure starting in the 2017-2018 school year and will replace ITP and MAP. This anticipated change will be determined by legislative action at the state level. I will keep you posted on this topic.

"Whoa, these guys are very good!"


"Whoa, that guy is playing 5 instruments (percussion)!"

Dear Dubuque Community School District Family,

Student safety has long been a priority for the Dubuque Community School District. As we recognize this week as National School Safety Week, know that we work each day to ensure that our students encounter an environment in our schools that fosters learning while being safe and inclusive.

In recent years, the district has worked to revise its safety protocols to better respond to emergencies – in particular, enhancing our protocol for responding to active intruder situations. Working with area law enforcement, the district has transitioned from a one-size-fits-all model to an options-based approach that empowers individuals to make the best decision possible should they encounter an active intruder situation.

Over the course of the next several weeks, students in all district schools will participate in a safety training exercise. This will consist of a short video presentation (with separate videos for elementary school and secondary school students) that introduces these updated safety protocols in an age-appropriate format. The exercise will also give students the chance to process the video with their teacher, and participate in a lockdown exercise in their classroom.

These training sessions will discuss the options students and staff have should they encounter an intruder. Based on best practice responses across the nation, the training includes the following main components:

- EVACUATE running to escape the situation is an option
- LOCKDOWN locking down is still an option, and now may include additional safeguards such as barricading doors to stay safe.
- COUNTER as a last resort, individuals may need to throw items, kick, scream or shout to escape a dangerous encounter.

While we know these are sensitive topics to discuss with students, they are important to address. Just as we regularly hold fire and tornado drills, we plan to use regular discussions about active intruder situations to help students better understand their options for staying safe both in and out of school.

Overall, we hope this training is a positive, non-threatening way to raise awareness of safety issues and spark conversation. As always, schools will have additional support for students wishing to further process the exercise.

Thank you for your ongoing support of the Dubuque Community School District and our efforts to give all students a safe environment in which to learn and grow.
