In the spring of 2017, Prescott hosted an Arts Fair during the school day that allowed students to participate in many different forms of art. Both staff members and community members provided these opportunities. Students took a survey following the Arts Fair to identify high interest areas. We found that there is an interest in science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM). We are excited to announce that we are going to have an after-school STEAM club at Prescott. Ms. Weydert, Technology and Information Coach and Mrs. Wiskus, paraprofessional, will be leading a group of up to twenty 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders in this club. # Prescott Charter Renewal NOT Approved by the DCSD Board of Education: A Plan for Moving Forward

The most frequently addressed questions and concerns are addressed here:

- Our charter remains in effect until the end of the 2017-2018 school year.
- Families who students are currently enrolled at Prescott have the option for their students to remain at Prescott through the end of their 5th grade year.
- The majority of Prescott parents, students and staff have clearly indicated in a recent survey a preference for the
  continued use of Expeditionary Learning with an infusion of the arts, looping, fieldwork, the all-school musical, Rise
  and Shine and other beyond-the-school-day academic and arts-based opportunities. This is absolutely possible with
  or without our charter status.
- Charter transportation will remain in effect through the end of the 2017-2018 school year. Families using charter transportation now (either riding a DCSD bus or being reimbursed for transporting their children) will not have access to this option starting in the 2018-1019 school year.
- Students entitled for special education services that are eligible for specialized transportation services now will continue to have access to busing services as long as the students' IEP teams determine that this is a need.

- Families living in the Prescott's neighborhood school boundary that are currently enrolling their children in other schools will have the option to enroll their children at Prescott beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. This means that our total school enrollment may increase. We may add sections (more classrooms) to address increased enrollment.
- The hard cap on class size will no longer be in effect when our charter expires at the end of this school year. It's
  important to note that class sizes in the other DCSD Title 1 elementary schools are comparable to our current class
  sizes. We may see slight increases in class sizes or no increase in class sizes starting with the 2018-2019 school year.

# **Arrival and Dismissal**

Thank you for supporting a safe and smooth arrival and dismissal at Prescott. Mid-year is a good time to review our arrival and dismissal practices.

## **Arrival Options**

- 7:30-8:15am Rise and Shine. Mon-Thu. Open to all K-5 students. Students should arrive no earlier than 7:20am. Students may sit or stand quietly in the White St. entry while waiting for Rise and Shine to start. Students arriving after 7:40am will not be able to participate in Rise and Shine that day and parents will be called to pick up the child.
- 8:15-8:40 Just Read. Mon-Thu. Open to all K-5 students.
- 8:15-8:40 Choir. Mon, Tue, and Wed. Open to all 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade students
- 8:15-8:40 Breakfast Mon-Thu. Breakfast is 9:15-9:40 on Fri. Open to all K-5 students.

<u>8:30am</u> is the earliest arrival time for your child if he or she is not participating in the events listed above. Students wait on the playground and have two options: Stand in their assigned classroom line or walk the perimeter of the basketball court. (Due to the one-hour late arrivals, 9:30am is the earliest arrival time for students on Fridays.)

<u>8:40am</u> is the entry bell. This is the latest time students should be dropped off. All students will move to their classrooms at this time. (Due to the one-hour late arrivals, 9:40am is the latest time students should be dropped off on Fridays.)

<u>8:50am</u> is the tardy bell. All students must be in their seats in the classrooms to be considered on time. (Due to the one-hour late arrivals, 9:50am is the tardy bell on Fridays.)

- 3:40pm End of dismissal. Thank you for your support to have children picked up on time!
