From the Desk of Miss Mac

Greetings Sageville families,

Tonight the FBI Internet Safety session will be held at Washington Middle School at 6:30 PM. This session is free and parents are encouraged to attend.

PTC MOVIE NIGHT will be held on **Friday**, January 8th.

"Inside Out" will be shown. The event is free and concessions available for purchase. Wear your pj's and bring your lawn chair or blanket. **The doors will open at 6:15 p.m. and the movie will be shown at 6:45 p.m**. Students must be accompanied by an adult. In case of inclement weather, an automated phone call message will be sent and the event will be moved to Friday, January 15th.

January is typically the time for the winter window of assessment. Students in Grade 2-5 will take MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) in the areas of reading and math. They will begin next week and will continue through the end of January.

During the week of January 18th, students in Gr. K take a new reading assessment called FAST. (Formative Assessment System for Teachers). Grades 2-5 will take DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Early Language Skills). These are screening tools to assist teachers to take a closer look at the needs for instruction. Think about a screening tool this way: If your child seems worn down and his forehead is warm to the touch, you may assume he has a fever. But you probably also take his temperature with a thermometer and use the result to decide whether vou should put him to bed. schedule a doctor's appointment, or rush him to the emergency room. Universal screening measures, such as FAST or DIBELS, are the thermometer that can help teachers make better decisions about the reading instruction each child needs. Parents, you will get results from all of these assessments.

K-5 classroom teachers spent extra time at Sageville School on Tuesday afternoon. Our language arts content leader, Amy Rambousek, led us through a more detailed training on our new student reading software called Lexia. Ideally, each students spends approximating 20 minutes a day on this program. It is designed for school use only at this time. Students who struggle in certain areas are given extra instruction in that area with their classroom teacher or our Americorp workers.

Make sure your student is reading an extra 20 minutes per day and mark it on your January reading calendar!

During the week of January 4th – 8th I have been in kindergarten thru second grade. In kindergarten we worked on selfcontrol.
