

The state of Iowa recently released the school report card. The school ratings are composed of a combination of multiple measures included to calculate an overall score for each school in Iowa. Each of the measures gets calculated as a value between 0 and 100 and is then multiplied by a weight amount, producing a percentage score for each measure. The weighting is the value assigned to each indicator. The score for each measure is determined and then all measures are added together to create an overall score.
