## Counselor Corner...Mrs. Kaiser

It seems more and more that I am talking to students about conflicts that arise on social media apps at a younger age than I have in previous years. Some apps that I have found that students are using are Snap Chat, Musically and connecting with unfamiliar people on gaming devices. All technology can be great! However, there are times that I am truly concerned for the safety of our students. The American Academy of Pediatrics recently released findings from a comprehensive study on the impact of social media on kids and their families. During the study they found social media is on the rise which in return increases the risk of cyber-bullying, "facebook depression" (a new phenomenon where "de-friending" and online bullying lead to symptoms of depression), exposure to inappropriate content and sexting. Parents can take some easy steps to keep their children safe while utilizing technology. 1. Check privacy settings 2. No underage Facebook 3. Use filtering software **4.** Create ground rules **5.** Get to know what your child's habits are 6. Keep the computer in a central location 7. Urge your kids to avoid questionnaires 8. Monitor the pictures your child posts online 9. Be a good example on how to use social media 10. Limit cell phone use 11. Talk to kids about on-line dangers 12. Explore the apps your children are utilizing.
