Dear Parent(s):



Over the course of the last two years our teachers have been utilizing professional learning time to create lessons that include "real-world" experiences for your child. Teachers are designing instruction that provides a glimpse into what life will be like post-high school. In order for this to happen, we teach students a set of skills that will allow them to be productive citizens and experience success in college or with a career later in life. At some point, you may have heard your child or a teacher refer to "21st Century" skills. Even though we are many years into this century, it's still the title that we use to describe how we are going about providing students with relevant, authentic learning experiences, and the skills to be successful.

In our district, and at Roosevelt, we have identified **four 21st Century skill areas** as being important for our students. They are:

- 1. **Digital-Age Literacy** The ability to evaluate and create meaning out of multiple forms of information.
- 2. Critical Thinking and Problem Solving The ability to use higher-order thinking and reasoning to solve an authentic real-world problem.
- Communication and Collaboration The ability to apply knowledge to communicate and collaborate with others to reach a goal or create a project.
- **4. Creativity and Innovation** The ability to develop original ideas and create products by using inventive thinking and research.

What do you think of our four skill areas? Are there other skill areas you would like your child to learn before they graduate high school? Please do not hesitate to give me a call if you would like to discuss what we are doing to help prepare your child for a challenging and exciting future!

Parent Teacher Conferences - Thank you to all the parents who attended our Parent teacher conferences. The time that each of you dedicated to better understand your child's learning experiences is very much appreciated.

Student Survey - In April we will be administering a survey to your child that is a requirement of the state of Iowa Department of Education. The survey is called *The Conditions of Learning*, and it's for students who are in grades 5-12. Please be looking for an informational email with more details soon.


