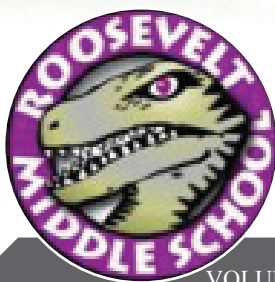


ELEANOR **ROOSEVELT REPORT** MIDDLE SCHOOL

Dear Parent(s):

In mid-January I had the honor of attending the Martin Luther King Jr. Tribute contest ceremony hosted by the local chapter of the NAACP. Eleven sixth and eighth grade students from Roosevelt were local winners in the contest this year. You may have seen their work featured in the Telegraph Herald. Simply put, it was amazing! There were well over 200 entries this year in the local contest, and for our school to have eleven winners is a testament to the quality of our contest entries and the work of the students! Congratulations!

Our second round of Parent-Teacher-Student conferences is coming soon. Conference dates are Thursday, February 16, Wednesday, February 22, and Thursday, February 24. Please be looking for a letter from me with details on times, along with information on signing up for a conference time online. Last fall we had a record-setting turnout for conferences, and we are hoping for the same again in February. These meetings are an important part of our educational program as teachers have a great opportunity to partner with you in the education of your child. Thank you for taking the time to support the learning happening here at Roosevelt by attending conferences.

Monday through Thursday of each week we begin our school day with community building time in our homeroom setting. You may have heard your child speak of this research-based program we call 'Raptor Time'. Staff members begin 'Raptor Time' each day promptly at 7:38 AM. Some students are arriving after this start time and are tardy to school. In order to have everyone present for this important start to the day, if you drive your child to school, we ask that you arrive by the entry time of 7:30 AM. This will allow your child ample time to get to the house area, go to the locker and get organized for the day, and be ready to participate in the 'Raptor Time' activities by 7:38 AM.

Lastly, in early February, the parents of 65 eighth grade students will receive a letter with information regarding the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) tests that will take place here on March 8. Students are randomly selected. This important national exam, sometimes referred to as the “nations report card”, is important in gauging student academic growth nationally. Your support and encouragement for your child, if selected for the exam, is greatly appreciated.

IT'S TIME TO GET THE FLU SHOT FOR YOUR FAMILY!

The symptoms of influenza (flu) appear suddenly and often include:

- * Fever of 100F to 104F, which can reach 106F when symptoms first develop. Fever is usually continuous, but it may come and go. Fever may be lower in older adults than in children and younger adults. When fever is high, other symptoms usually are more severe.

- * Body aches and muscle pain (often severe), commonly in the back, arms, or legs.

- * Headache

- * Pain when you move your eyes.

- * Fatigue, a general feeling of sickness (malaise), and loss of appetite.

- * A dry cough, runny nose, and dry or sore throat. You may not notice these during the first few days of the illness when other symptoms are more severe. As your fever goes away, these symptoms may become more evident.

Along with the recommendation that all staff and students receive the flu vaccine, the Dubuque Community School District will start the implementation of not returning to school until free from fever (greater than or equal to 100 F), diarrhea or vomiting without the use of medications for 24 hours to help reduce
