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Dear Parents/Guardians:

Thank you to everyone that attended our second round of parent-student-teacher conferences in February. Our attendance rate was at 80%, a small increase from the previous year. Your continued interest in your child's learning is one of the most influential factors in promoting learning success here at school.

Does your child still have her/his school issued student identification (ID) card and lanyard? In an effort to provide a safe learning environment for all students at Roosevelt, this year we have been requiring our students to wear their ID in a visible way each school day. (This is true for all secondary schools in Dubuque.) As we are now in the third trimester of the school year, we are starting to see a slight increase in the number of students without an identification card. Would you please remind your child that wearing their ID card in a visible way is an important part of safety plan at Roosevelt, and that it's important for checking out library books, purchasing school lunches, purchasing tickets for dances or PBIS events, etc? If your child needs a replacement card, please ask them to come to the main office to purchase a new one. The cost is \$3.00.

With the days of winter fast becoming a memory, it is a good time to share some information on our school safety plan regarding tornado season. On March 29, Roosevelt did participate in the city and statewide tornado drill. We practice this drill with our students at least four times a year. Our goal is to have all students in shelter areas in about four minutes. We are usually successful with that goal. The ERMS campus has several areas on the lower level that are safe shelters. We always have a weather radio that is set to receive all weather announcements for Dubuque County and surrounding counties. Upon the announcement of a tornado watch, everyone in the school is notified. The school then continues to operate in a normal manner, but attention to the weather conditions is intensified. Upon receiving a tornado warning, students and staff immediately move to their designated tornado shelters. I am always impressed with how our students participate in these drills in a serious and responsible way.

Notice for Eleanor Roosevelt Middle School Parents:

The Dubuque Community School District requires that your student be free of vomiting, diarrhea and fever (without Tylenol or Ibuprofen) for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

This requirement is made to help stop the spread of illness among other students and to provide your child with the necessary rest they need to recover.

IT'S TIME TO GET THE FLU SHOT FOR YOUR FAMILY!

The symptoms of influenza (flu) appear suddenly and often include:

- * Fever of 100F to 104F, which can reach 106F when symptoms first develop.

Fever is usually continuous, but it may come and go. Fever may be lower in older adults than in children

and younger adults. When fever is high, other symptoms usually are more severe.

- * Body aches and muscle pain (often severe), commonly in the back, arms, or legs.

- * Headache

- * Pain when you move your eyes.

- * Fatigue, a general feeling of sickness (malaise), and loss of appetite.

- * A dry cough, runny nose, and dry or sore throat. You may not notice these during the first few days of the illness when other symptoms are more severe. As your fever goes away, these symptoms may become more evident.

Along with the recommendation that all staff and students receive the flu vaccine, the Dubuque Community School District will start the implementation of not returning to school until free from fever (greater than or equal to 100 F), diarrhea or vomiting without the use of medications for 24 hours to help reduce the spread of germs that cause diarrhea, colds and influenza. In addition, we will be reminding staff and students of the importance of good hand washing

Best procedure for your convenience: ERMS Attendance procedure for picking up your student for an appointment during school hours.
