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notes from Mr. Johll

Dear Parent(s):



With the tragedy that occurred on February 14, 2018, at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, I have been receiving a few inquiries from parents on what they should say and/or do with their child(ren) at home. Please know that I greatly appreciate it when parents/guardians ask me these types of questions. Never hesitate to contact me. Here are a few points of information that I would like to share that I hope you will find helpful.

The American School Counselor Association (ASCA) has provided schools with some tips for how to respond and work with students. As parents, you might also find some of these to be valuable. First, the ASCA suggests that it's very important to keep normal routines going. As educators, we know that students find security and predicatibility in having routines each day. It's calming and reassuring. Also suggested by the ASCA is to limit exposure to the events on the news, but at the same time, be honest and share as much information as your child can appropriately handle. In my opinion, the most important tip they shared is to listen carefully to the fears and concerns of your child(ren). As I discussed in my February newsletter article, having candid and open conversations at the dinner table where you empathetically listen to how they are feeling is so very important and powerful. Of equal importance, make sure to reassure your child(ren) that the world is truly a good place, and that Roosevelt is a safe school, with caring staff.

Another prominent national organization, the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP) also recommends that in talking about these tragedies, to make sure all comments that you share are appropriate for the age of your child(ren). The NASP also shared that middle and high school students will want to share their thoughts on what happened, and they may even want to provide suggestions on how the school could improve their safety measures. Sometimes it may take a good question from you to prompt the conversation, but then they will want to share. Please know that we will always listen to those suggestions here at school. This helps in dealing with tragedies like Florida.

Before the winter break, we did a district approved safety intruder lesson during morning homebase with students. Students were taught the different ways that we can all respond in the case of an intruder in our building. We also showed a district secondary schools safety video. Please talk with your child about this lesson, and remind them, if "they see something, to be sure to say something" to any staff member in the building.

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With the days of winter fast becoming a memory, it is a good time to share some information on our drills that will occur now that we are in tornado season. This spring, Roosevelt will once again participate in the city and statewide tornado drill. Tornado drills are done four times a year. With a tornado drill, our goal is to have all 1,104 students in shelter areas in approximately four minutes. We are usually successful with that goal. The ERMS campus has several areas on the lower level that are safe shelters. We always have a weather radio that is set to receive all weather announcements for Dubuque County and surrounding counties. Upon the announcement of a tornado watch, everyone in the school is notified. The school then continues to operate in a normal manner, but attention to the weather conditions is intensified. Upon receiving a tornado warning, students and staff immediately move to designated tornado shelters. I am always impressed with how our students participate in these drills in a serious and responsible way.
