At Roosevelt, all athletic opportunities meet after the conclusion of the school day. With athletics, Eleanor Roosevelt offers a skills development program for sixth grade students focusing on the areas of track, basketball, football, and volleyball. LEAP stands for Leadership Enrichment After-School Programs. The goal of Roosevelt's LEAP Programming is to allow our students to become involved in new and diverse experiences through a wide variety of after-school activities. Co-curricular opportunities and activities offered at Roosevelt include choir, show choir, band, jazz band, orchestra, and chamber orchestra. BEST PROCEDURE FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE:

ERMS Attendance procedure for picking up your student for an appointment during school hours.

- Send a note with your student in the morning.
- The note should include: Student's name, pick-up time, reason for leaving early, and parent's signature.
- The student should bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. He or she will be given a pass out of class in exchange for the note.
- Then your student will meet you at the east door by the flag pole. And he or she can come out when you pull up to the curb.

Option 2: If you know in advance that your child will miss school you can send an email to ERMSAttendance@dbqschools.org. Please include your child's name, pick-up time and reason for leaving early.

If you need to pick up your student due to a last minute situation, you may call the attendance line at 552-5012. If we received the information through a phone call, then you have to meet your student in the building. In that case you will need to come through the door by the flag pole. Then check in with the secretary at the window.
