NOTES FROM MR. JOHLL

Dear Roosevelt families:

Happy November! I hope that this newsletter finds you and your family doing well, enjoying the seasonal fall weather.

TRIMESTER 2 | It's hard to believe that in a few days we will begin the second trimester of the 2020-2021 school year. The first day for Group 2 (Hybrid B) students is Thursday, November 19, and the first day for Group 1 (Hybrid A) will be on Friday, November 20. Because your child(ren) will have a new specialist class (Art, Health, or Gen. Music), I recommend that you take some time next week to review their schedule on Infinite Campus. For our Fully-Online students, their new courses will be made available and ready on Thursday, November 19.

PBIS | For both our hybrid and fully-online families, you may have heard your child use the acronym PBIS. If you are new to Roosevelt this year, you may be wondering what that means. PBIS stands for Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports. It's an organizational structure that we have implemented with our staff and students that allows us to create a positive learning community. It's not a curriculum, nor is it a lock-step program, but instead it's a structured approach for positively interacting and working with our students. The emphasis of PBIS is built on a school-wide philosophy that our staff will teach, model, and reinforce the positive student behaviors needed to be successful in learning.

We have been a PBIS school for many years, and we are continuing to use it this year with our hybrid students. We are also in the planning stages to expand our use with fully-online students during the second trimester.



My guess is that you might have overheard talk about some of the monthly PBIS activities that we offer to promote and encourage a positive culture at Roosevelt, or maybe you've heard about the three guiding principles for our program. Here at Roosevelt we strive to promote a culture where students can

demonstrate that they are **Ready** to learn, **Responsible** for what they do, and **Respectful** in their actions. These three guiding principles are known as the "3 R's" of our PBIS program. Students who demonstrate the "3 R's" are recognized by our staff members with a Raptor Recognition Ticket. These tickets are not a reward, but instead a recognition shown to the student for their appropriate display of behavior or for following the expectations of the school. Students can then use these tickets for the monthly PBIS events, or other special activities provided by their house teachers. In September we had a "Lunch on the Lawn" day for our students, and in October the PBIS team sponsored "Costume Day" for students.

We continue to use the PBIS approach with our students because it works! PBIS is led here at Roosevelt by a staff leadership team, which in turn is led by two staff coaches, Mrs. Rigdon and Mrs. Ligeralde. I want to publicly thank both of them and our team for their leadership of this work. It is also important to note that this is a school initiative that our PTO continues to support each year, and I want to publicly say thank you for their help with our events and activities.

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, & DISCRIMINATION ARE NOT ALLOWED | With this newsletter I want to share a new electronic reporting option that anyone may use to report a concern. The new online concern form can be found at this district link: **https://www.dbqschools.org/parents/say-something/**. It is available to all students, staff, parents, and community members to use, and it can be submitted anonymously. If a concern is shared electronically, it will be routed directly to me as the school principal as well as to our district office. Please know that this new form is not intended to replace the current communication channels we have in place to let us know of any bullying, harassment, or discrimination. We are committed to creating a safe learning environment for all of our hybrid and fully online learning students.

LOCKERS | By the time you are reading this article, all hybrid students will have received a school locker to use. With colder weather approaching, we are utilizing the lockers for coats, hats, and gloves. It can also be used to store after-school athletic practice gear. We will not use them for any other purpose, and our plan is to continue with books bags during the school day. In the morning your child(ren) should still report directly to their homebase classroom Monday through Thursday, and their first period class on Friday, and from there they will be dismissed in small groups to go to their locker, if needed. A similar process will be used at the end of the day.

AT HOME LEARNING | For our hybrid parents and guardians, we need your help. It would be wonderful if you could have another conversation with your child(ren) regarding their routine/schedule on the days they are learning from home. As you know, the work being assigned by our teachers on those days is critically important to providing your child(ren) with a full-year of academic standards and learning. We are noticing that some students are not logging in to Canvas on the at-home learning days, and some are coming back to school the next day with tasks unfinished. Your emphasis to them on the importance of completing their assigned tasks is very much appreciated! We also greatly appreciate your efforts in monitoring their work from home!

ERMS ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

Best procedure for your convenience:

ERMS Attendance procedure for picking up your student for an appointment during school hours.

- Send a note with your student in the morning.
- The note should include: Student's name, pick-up time, reason for leaving early, and parent's signature.
- The student should bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. He or she will be given a pass out of class in exchange for the note.
- Then your student will meet you at the east door by the flag pole. And he or she can come out when you pull up to the curb.

Option 2: If you know in advance that your child will miss school you can send an email to ermsattendance@dbqschools.org. Please include your child's name, pick-up time and reason for leaving early.

If you need to pick up your student due to a last minute situation, call the attendance line at 552-5012. If we received the information through a phone call, then you have to meet your student in the building. When picking up your student, you will need to wear a mask and enter the building through the door by the flag pole. Then check in with the secretary at the window.

Please notify us as early in the day as possible so that we can better serve you.


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MATH MASTERPIECES

If nothing works then an in building option is a last resort.

Information on School Plan: Principal Jeff Johll explained the school plan which drives the professional learning offered to teachers. Roosevelt is currently a targeted school with the state based on students with IEP's and people of color having lower than the states average for reading scores. After 3 year plan, when Roosevelt was tested all targeted goals were met. Will be tested after this school year and based on goals set after last testing, there is hope that Roosevelt will no longer be in the targeted group. Roosevelt has been recognized by the state as one of the top schools based on overall performance. The school plan includes two goals. The 1st goal is to enhance teaching and learning for all students in all content areas through professional learning on best practices through universal instruction. The 2nd goal is to enhance teaching and learning on all students in all content areas through professional learning on best practices in equity and inclusion and PBIS/Trauma Informed Care.

Dance: Christy Heller and Hayley Taylor stated all dances are cancelled at this time.

All PTO members in attendance agreed to defer the expense to be reviewed to be paid out of the school building budget, due to the fee being related to instruction.
