MUS 131: Senior High Orchestra Fall 2015, 5th Period Mr. Andrew Geyssens

Course Description

Orchestra is a two-semester, two-credit course that includes string orchestra, symphony orchestra, chamber orchestra, small ensembles, solo, musical pit opportunities. String students meet daily with the addition of winds and percussion (symphony orchestra) weekly. The literature is taken from all cultures and historical music eras. Students in the class will learn to perform a variety of musical styles, improve their technique, strengthen intonation, and learn good ensemble performance. They will also learn about music theory and music history. Students wishing to begin a string instrument may do so with the consent of the director. When sufficient skills are developed, they will participate in the orchestra ensemble.

Assessments

Students will be continually assessed through informally (aurally, visually, physically, and verbally) and formally during individual lessons and through teacher assisted self assessment. Individual lessons will occur weekly and will be scheduled during the first week of each semester. Lessons will concentrate on individual growth in musical technique, musicality, and theory. and will be documented weekly. Self assessments will occur after performances or other appropriate times throughout the course.

Content

Each concert cycle will reflect the progression of processes outline in the standard. We will:

- 1. Choose and/or discuss music as it relates to a given artistic goal.
- 2. Plan student outcomes as related to the final artistic endeavor of a musical performance.
- 3. Document student progress through a concert series based on individual/group outcomes.
- 4. Present all performances and information to the public.

Individual assessment information will be used to reflect and show student growth.

Instructional Strategies

Every opportunity to connect with individual students and facilitate their learning will be utilized with the entire musical faculty. Aural, visual, physical, and verbal stimuli will be used to actualize student goals and creativity. Examples include recordings, scores of music, verbal feedback, live musical examples, body posture and movement, practice regimens, and rote learning to accomplish goals.
