Dubuque Community School Fun Run





- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two every few weeks
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help a student catch up.

Literacy Screening

Beginning next week, students in kindergarten through fifth grade will be participating in Dubuque Community School Literacy Screening. Testers from the district will be in our school completing both individual and small group literacy screenings. In kindergarten, the students will be assessed on the FAST assessment and students in grades 1st through 5th, will be assessed on the DIBLES assessment. Once these assessments are completed, the teachers utilize the information that is gathered to help them to plan instruction appropriate to the individual needs of your child.

This is another great opportunity to encourage students to always do their best. Help your child to understand that the teachers can do a better job of making school exciting and challenging if all students give their best efforts to school work!

Ms. McCarron's Mail

Outside Ms. McCarron's office is a special board that is titled, "Ms. McCarron's Mail." Writing is such an important skill to practice, but often children do not understand the power of authentic writing. To help



children to be motivated to write, to share ideas, and to get have the opportunity to connect with Ms. McCarron on an individual basis, Ms. McCarron invites all students to write her a letter and to drop it into her mailbox. Once Ms. McCarron receives a letter, she writes a return letter. Consider helping your child to write a letter or have your whole family draft a letter. The first student letters have arrived and kids are asking great questions, have shared what they did over the summer and what they love about Bryant. What a great way for Ms. McCarron to get to know the Bryant Bulldogs!
