# **MEASURES OF ACADEMIC PROGRESS (MAP)**

All 2<sup>nd</sup> graders and select 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders will be taking MAP tests between Jan. 11-29. MAP tests are web-based and adaptive. That means that the difficulty of the questions presented to each child is unique and based on how well they answering questions. We use these results along with other measures to inform our instruction with students. Results will be sent home on Thursday, February 11.

#### WINTER LITERACY SCREENING

All students in grades K-5 will take a winter literacy screening in January. State law requires a screening to be done every fall, winter and spring. Depending on how well a child does, his/her reading performance will be categorized as "On Track", "At-Risk", or "Substantially Deficient". This assessment is administered individually to students and takes about 9 minutes. We use these results to understand the impact of our instruction and to make adjustments so that all children can grow as readers.

# JANUARY MESSAGE FROM A COMMUNITY PARTNER: JUVENILE COURT SERVICES

Welcome back to school, we hope you had a wonderful winter break. It is fun to hear about everyone's individual winter break celebrations and gift giving. Did you know the best gift you can give your child is the gift of a good education? And the best place to get that education is in school. Every day. On time.

Building a habit of good attendance is your child's ticket to success in school and eventually in life and on the job. Every year, absences spike in the weeks before and after winter break. It's time to break that cycle. We know it's tempting to extend your break by a few days on either side of the holiday. We hope our DCSD Families have not done that this winter break.

Just a few missed days here and there, even if they're excused absences, can add up to too much lost learning time and put your child behind in school. This is as true in kindergarten as it is in high school. So make sure your child is in school every day. Our teachers will be teaching and our students will be learning. But it's harder to teach and it's harder to learn when too many students are absent. If missing school is unavoidable, talk to your children's teachers in advance to create a plan for making up missed work. Give your child the gift of attendance and the habit of attendance.
