### Dear Parents,

I cannot tell you how impressed I am with the Carver Community and its support of the students and teachers. To think that in the first two months of school the PTG served 780 desserts at Open House, bagged popcorn for 1,000 students, and had another successful fundraiser and book fair. AMAZING!!!!

All of this would not be possible without volunteers. Helping out at your child's school may seem too big of a time commitment to even consider. But study after study has shown that children whose parents are involved in their education do better in school. There are countless ways to help, both during the school day and in the evenings.

#### If you are available during the day:

- Library Helper: The Carver library welcomes volunteers who can help shelve books, assist children in picking out materials, and gather materials for teachers. Contact Carver's LRC teacher, Donna Schmitt, if you have time to spend in our library.
- Classroom Helper: Many times there is a need for an adult to read with students, practice math facts, or assist in completing missed classroom work. Contact your child's teacher if you are interested in helping in a classroom.
- Special Events: PTG, teachers, and I need extra assistance when there's a special event planned, like picture day or popcorn day. If you see an event on the calendar or hear of an upcoming event from your child, contact us to see if you can help.
- Field Trips: Volunteer on field trips by helping supervise small-group activities and keeping students on task, making the field trip a truly educational experience. Let the teacher know if you're interested in volunteering as a chaperone. Don't forget to fill out the volunteer disclosure form before going.

### If you are available after school:

- Family Nights: The PTG has put together a list of events held monthly for Carver families. While these events are major projects, PTG feels strongly about bringing parents together to meet each other. In the future be looking for information on a Carver Night at the Fighting Saints, skiing at Sundown, and the Carver Vendor Fair.
- Special Committees: Carver has a Site Council and a PTG that meets on a regular basis. Both of these committees serve vital roles at Carver. If you want to become a member of Site Council, contact me at Carver or attend a PTG meeting the second Tuesday of the month at Carver in room 208.

# **Cooler Weather/Safety Reminders**

- Call the DCSD weather line at 552-3035 for school delays or cancellation information rather than calling school.
- Sign up for Iowa School Alerts, a free notification service. Details are available on our district web site at <a href="http://www.dbqschools.org/district/departments/transportation/delays-cancellations/">http://www.dbqschools.org/district/departments/transportation/delays-cancellations/</a>.
- Cancellation of school, or delays due to inclement weather, will be announced on local radio stations beginning at 5:30 a.m.
- Early dismissals will be announced by 10:30 a.m. Information will also be announced on local radio stations and television throughout the day.
- In the event there is a late arrival, AM preschool will be cancelled. If there is an early dismissal, PM preschool will be cancelled. Students that attend preschool all day will have the same adjusted arrival or dismissal time as the rest of the school.
- Breakfast will not be available if there is a <u>two hour</u> late arrival.
- Establish and talk with your children about a plan for unexpected early outs due to weather <u>BEFORE</u> the next ice/snow storm.
- Dress students appropriately for winter weather. Students will be outdoors for recess unless the temperature dips below zero.
- Students should <u>NOT</u> be on the playground before 8:30 a.m. There is no adult supervision before that time.
- Drivers, please allow extra time for dealing with snow and ice. Follow the parking lot procedures and drive slowly as you come into our school community. It's worth the inconvenience for the safety of our children!

Today I want to share some websites where kids can create art works. As always, I believe the best way for kids to explore the Internet is under adult supervision. Besides, playing with our kids and digital art is FUN!



If your kids love to color, they'll enjoy playing with the digital patterns at <u>Scrap</u> <u>Coloring</u>. There are many templates to choose from, then areas within these can be filled with either solid color or a range of patterns. The patterns can also be reconfigured by adjusting the colors.

At <u>Bomomo</u>, children can experiment to their heart's content. There's a range of interesting tools, and the best way to discover what they can do is to simply try them. Click one of the icons at the bottom of the screen, then move and click your mouse to make a cool abstract composition. If you can't save the creation, try taking a screen grab of it.





One great thing about websites that allow us to explore and play with art is that we may be encouraged to go on from there to try a similar activity in real life. <u>Aminah's</u> <u>World</u> is a website presented by the Columbus Museum of Art. Here kids can choose a digital background then build a collage by layering kente cloth and other fabric scraps, found objects, shells, and yarn. Objects can be moved and re-sized, and the result printed out.

Another website that facilitates lots of art exploration is **Toy Theater**. The art activities there include building with colored blocks, doodling, designing, animation, and a glimpse into processes like Matisse's painting, and Japanese



Some people disapprove of digital play for kids. They believe screen-based fun distracts kids from more important things — like reading, painting, and learning. Many parents, however, try to help their children find a balance. If you're one of the latter, I hope you and your kids will enjoy exploring and playing with digital art. I truly believe exploring WITH our kids online opens up all sorts of possibilities for discussion and learning.

# Notes from the Health Office

### Hi Carver Families!



With cold and flu season fast approaching and as the number of incidents start to increase, we will be implementing the 24-hour Protocol soon that will last through the flu season. This means that students and staff should be free of fever (greater than or equal to 100), diarrhea, and vomiting for 24 hours <u>WITHOUT the use of medication</u> before they may return to school. In addition, we really need to step up awareness of good hand washing to prevent the spread of these illnesses. Good hand washing is the number one defense against sickness. Please share with your children the importance of this simple, yet effective step in stopping the spread of germs.

Keystone AEA will be performing their annual hearing tests for all students in grades K-2 this month. The testing dates are scheduled for November 7th, 9th, and 11th, with a retest being held on November 16th. If you have a child not included in these grade levels, but have concerns regarding their hearing and feel he/she may benefit from a hearing test, please let us know and we can arrange one.

Vision screenings are currently in progress. This year, we will be doing all students in grades K through 5 due to an exciting new program that is being offered to each elementary school in the District. The Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque has partnered with a program called Vision to Learn that will provide free eye exams and free glasses to students that fail the annual school screening. Last year, we piloted the program in 5 of the elementary schools. This year, the vision program will expand to all 13 Dubuque public elementary schools.
