

Parents-

It's time for the **20 for 20 Family Reading Challenge!** We know at this time of the year it starts to get difficult to "fit in" all that needs to be done in a day, but we are hoping you will make a **COMMITMENT** to set aside 20 minutes a night to read with your child for the next 20 school days!

Here is how the challenge works. For every night you read with your child, they will earn a ticket. Your child should **fill out the ticket** with a connection he/she makes as described below. When your child brings back the ticket, they will get another ticket to complete. The ticket will go into a drawing for books, posters and a NEW BIKE! This means that if a child reads for 20 minutes for 20 days, they would have 20 chances to win a prize. The drawing will be on June 1st during the end of the year assembly.



Students must provide evidence that they read by making a connection:

**Text to Text:** student connects what he/she reads to another book read

**Text to Self:** student connects what he/she reads to something that has happened to him/her

**Text to World:** student connects what he/she reads to something that is happening in the world.

The challenge will start Monday, May 1<sup>st</sup>. Students should take home their first ticket on Monday and complete one ticket per day.

If students would prefer submit a ticket **ELECTRONICALLY** instead of a paper ticket, they can do so by submitting an entry to our Carver 20 for 20 Seesaw Class. To do this, students must:

1. Open the Seesaw app or click on SIGN IN on the website: [seesaw.me](https://seesaw.me)
2. Choose "I'm a Student"
3. Choose Email/Google Account
4. Choose "New Student?"
5. Choose "Create Email Account"
6. Enter Join code: PQXWEOJH and tap the green circle
7. Enter First Name, Last Name, Email and Password.  
Students should use their "school" username and password to create this account:

Password: use school 6 digit password  
Click on Done
8. Students can choose to make a connection one of 4 ways:
  - I. Photo and Voice Recording
  - II. Video
  - III. Drawing and Voice Recording
  - IV. Note



Post only your WOW work! Remember, your post represents you and will have a big audience- the Carver Community!

- Your audience should get value from seeing your work. Value means that your audience will learn something from your post and will be able to discuss it with you.
- Your posts represent you to the outside world. Make sure you leave a good digital footprint.
- Make sure you are posting only public information (ok to post for the world to see) vs private information.
