# Principal's Corner

MAP Test: Students in 2nd -5th grade will be taking the MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) Test starting next week. The MAP Test measures what students know and informs what they're ready to learn next. By adjusting to each student's performance, MAP creates personalized experience that assessment measures performance whether a student performs on, above, or below grade level. Here are some things you can do to help your child do his/her

1) Encourage your child to take the test seriously and not see the test as a nuisance or as a from "real" break school. 2) Continue to maintain a consistent family routine (stress or conflict before the test interfere with may vour child's performance), and

3) Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep before the test and that he/she eats a healthy breakfast in the morning.

One of the most important factors of being successful during MAP is for students to attend all days of testing, try their best on the test, and do not interrupt others. Parents play a huge role in achieving this success; so please help us to provide a positive testing experience for your child
