Below are some of the ways that parents and visitors can assist the Carver staff to ensure we are continuing to provide safe learning a environment for everyone in our building.

 Be patient. We will be implementing new practices, tweaking current practices and asking more questions of visitors to our building.

- See/hear something ... say something. As we've informed our students and staff ... if something looks or sounds suspicious it's better to be proactive and alert someone than to say nothing at all.
- Always enter the building through the main school doors (by the flag pole).
- If you are not currently in our Raptor System, be sure to bring your driver's license to check in if you are coming to visit (i.e. volunteer in a classroom, eat lunch with your child, etc.).
- Always display your visitors badge on your upper torso while in the building.
- When you are ready to leave the building, please check out in the office and return your visitor badge, so you can be checked out of our system.
- If you are bringing something for your child (i.e. lunch, book bag, etc.), please know that it will be delivered to the classroom by a staff member.
