Kindergarten News

Kindergarten students are as busy as bees!

In language arts, the children are learning about everyday special celebrations. They are learning how family celebrations of losing a tooth, riding a bike, having a good sports game or dance recital can all be everyday celebrations. They are also learning about special celebrations such holidays, and why people like to celebrate. On that note, we recently celebrated Dr. Seuss's birthday by reading a variety of his books, and sharing in a variety of activities such as graphing goldfish crackers to go along with One Fish Two Fish, Red Fish Blue Fish and focusing on rhyming words with The Cat in the Hat.

In science, students recently started a new unit called, Materials and Motion. In this unit, they will be learning more about the properties of wood and paper, along with how these different materials can be changed. Students will discover how things move using different kinds of force. As a culminating activity for this unit, we anticipate going on a field trip to Cherry Lanes, in April.

In connection with science and spring, we have some fun field trips planned towards the end of the year. We hope to go on a farm field trip and have a guest speaker from the agriculture department come to do a class presentation to teach us about farm animals, and new life in the spring. We also hope to go to Adam's Pet Hospital in connection with our unit on community helpers, and compare and contrast farm and pet animals.

With May comes Mother's Day. A kindergarten tradition is to hold a Mother's Day Tea. In order to honor the mothers, we invite them to a special celebration to recognize all they do for us. So,

In math, the children are using comparisons to become better estimators. They continue to work on number sense by learning how to express their ideas when participating in number talks, and solving a variety of addition and subtraction story problems using multiple strategies.

As spring fast approaches, with the change in daylight savings time, with spring sports starting soon, our last trimester of school will fly by. We will continue to work hard and do our best to get ready for first grade!
