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## **School Principal News!**

Greetings! I hope you all enjoyed the recent Thanksgiving holiday and that you are looking forward to the upcoming winter season. In an attempt to be more "green" and reduce paper and printing consumption, we are shifting our monthly Eisenhower Express newsletter to strictly an electronic version sent via email and also posted to our school website. We hope you find this way of sending out information more convenient to your family.

There are a few grade level special events this month and a particular one of note is the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade music program at Roosevelt Middle School on December 8 at 6:30 (students should arrive at 6:00 p.m.). Ms. McCormick and Ms. Scholtes, our music teachers, have been working hard with the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders and they are getting ready to put on a great concert!

As the weather turns to winter, please make sure your child has the appropriate winter clothing to wear to school. Kids need their fresh air and time to run around during the day so we have recess every day, even when it's cold. We only have indoor morning line-up or stay inside for recess when the temperature and/or wind chill is 0 or below. Thanks for making sure the students have appropriate hats, gloves, coats, snow pants, etc.

Speaking of winter weather, I wanted to make a clarification in case we have a situation of a weather delay, especially on a Friday. All 2-hour delays will result in students beginning school at 10:25 (2 hours later than our normal time of 8:25). IF the district ever calls a 2-hour delay on a Friday, the 2 hour delay is figured from our normal starting time of 8:25 so students would begin at 10:25. Basic rule of thumb is: When there is a 2-hour delay, students will enter the building at 10:25, even if it's on a Friday.

With the holidays quickly approaching, it seems technology items are often at the top of many wish lists. In light of that, the school district has prepared the following statement as a resource for parents who wish to read up on some guidance from "Common Sense Media" regarding appropriate technology equipment and usage for children:

Topics include screen time, privacy and internet safety, Facebook, Instagram, and Social, Cell Phone Parenting, and let's not forget. Learning with Technology!

"Learn how to spot the good stuff, find the right product for your kids' needs, and foster a love of learning." Topics are broken into Preschoolers (2-4), Little Kids (5-7), Big Kids (8-9), and Tweens (10-12). Check out the <u>Top Common Core Games and Apps</u> to "find grade-specific tools, tips, and ideas to boost kids' grasp of Common Core standards outside the classroom."

Are you considering getting your child a cell phone? Be sure to read the article under <u>Cell Phone Parenting</u> section, entitled, "<u>What's the right age to get my kid a cell phone</u>?" And learn what can you do as a parent if <u>your kid texts constantly</u>. Finally, learn about your child's digital footprint by evaluating whether or not it is safe to <u>post pictures of your kid online</u>.
