School Principal News!

Hello Eisenhower Families,

I was going to say that spring has finally arrived, but the snow we had earlier this week certainly put that in doubt. I sure hope we can put the hats, gloves, and snow items away for good very soon!

Now that we are back from spring break, it's surprising to note that we have exactly two months of school left. It seems this school year has gone so fast! Our last day for students will be Tuesday, June 5 and it will be a full day of school. We look forward to being in a routine and having full weeks of school so that teachers and students can close the year on a strong note and solidify all of the new learning that has taken place this school year. We appreciate that you continue to make school a priority and ensure you student is here every possible day on time and ready to learn. When your child is late or absent, it does affect their learning. Thanks for keeping us informed when illness or special circumstances come up.

We just started our spring MAP assessments this week and they will continue until April 20 for students in 2nd-5th grade. Your child's teacher will keep you informed of the exact date of your child's testing for both a reading and math assessment. Upcoming we have the spring FAST language arts assessment for students in Kindergarten-5th grade taking place April 30 and May 1. This is a brief, 5 minute reading screening that students take three times each year. You will receive results of both of the MAP and FAST assessments at the end of the school year. Please encourage your child to work hard and take these spring assessments seriously, as we use this data to make important educational decisions and it allows us to see the great academic growth they have made this year.

Our Kindergarten Welcome events will take place coming up on April 17th and 19th from 5:30-7:00 p.m. in our gym. Those with last names starting with A-L should attend on the 17th and M-Z should come on the 19th. If you have a conflict on your scheduled night, feel free to come on the other evening. If you know of anyone who has not already received information from Eisenhower or the school district and who is living in the Eisenhower district and has a child turning 5 years old on or before September 15, 2018, please encourage them to contact our main office at 563-552-3500. We look forward to welcoming a new incoming kindergarten class!

The last couple of months of school will be busy so keep an eye on our calendar for upcoming events. We will have our annual "book swap" on April 19, sponsored by the Eisenhower PTO. You can send in books to be included in the swap any day from April 16-18. JIM SPORLEDER "PAPER TIGERS"

Jim Sporleder is a retired Principal of Lincoln High School in Walla Walla, WA. Lincoln High School became a "Trauma Informed" school, gaining national attention due to a dramatic drop in out of school suspensions, increased graduation rates and the number of students going on to post-secondary education. The story is the focus of the documentary "Paper Tigers."

Jim will be hosting a viewing of the award-winning documentary **Paper Tigers** and a discussion of how traumasensitive practice changed the culture of the school and the lives of its students. A question and answer session with Mr. Sporleder will follow.

HEATHER FORBES, LCSW BATTLING BAD BEHAVIORS

Heather is an internationally published author on the topics of raising children with difficult and severe behaviors, the impact of trauma on the developing child, and self-development.

Much of her experience and insight on understanding trauma, disruptive behaviors, and adoption-related issues comes from her direct mothering experience of her two adopted children.

Heather Forbes will provide a live virtual presentation over Zoom. "Battling Bad Behaviors." When we look beyond the behaviors, the science really is giving us the answers. She will give you everything you need to help a child not only change his/her behavior but to heal from traumatic experiences. Heather will share multiple examples of typical behaviors we see from children and apply the science in a practical and common sense way. A question and answer session will follow.

SCREEN TIME LIMITS NEEDED!!

This information came from the Iowa Department of Education Healthy Schools Newsletter. You may want to check out the websites listed if you are concerned about your teen's screen time use. Also, this is a good reason to limit your younger children from excessive screen time!

A study published in the Clinical Psychological Science journal and reported by <u>The Washington Post</u> in 2017 outlined some serious health issues among teenagers across the country. Nearly a half a million U.S. teens (ages 13 to 18) completed questionnaires about how much they use their devices (smartphone, tablet, computer), sleep habits and also their general attitudes and feelings. The analysis revealed a sharp jump in depression and suicidal thoughts when screen time increased. And nearly half of U.S. teens are seriously sleep-deprived. Leadership Students Fundraiser!

Did you know that around the world, 783 million people don't have access to clean, dedicated drinking water? In 1997, about half of the population of Africa suffered from at least one major water-related illness and currently 2,000 children under the age of 5 die each day from contaminated water. People in sub-Saharan Africa walk as many as 8 hours a day fetching water which is often from unclean sources. A full water jug weighs 40 pounds and is carried many miles often on top of women's heads. Many girls are unable to attend school because their job is to provide water for their families. Eisenhower can help! This month, leadership students will be collecting money to help provide clean water to Homacho, Ethiopia. We will be working with the organization, "Friends of Homacho" which is a local organization that provides hope to the people in and around Homacho, Ethiopia through clean water projects, education, and infrastructure aid. During the week of April 16th-20th Eisenhower students can bring in their coins to support this important project. We can make a difference in the lives of others by giving!
